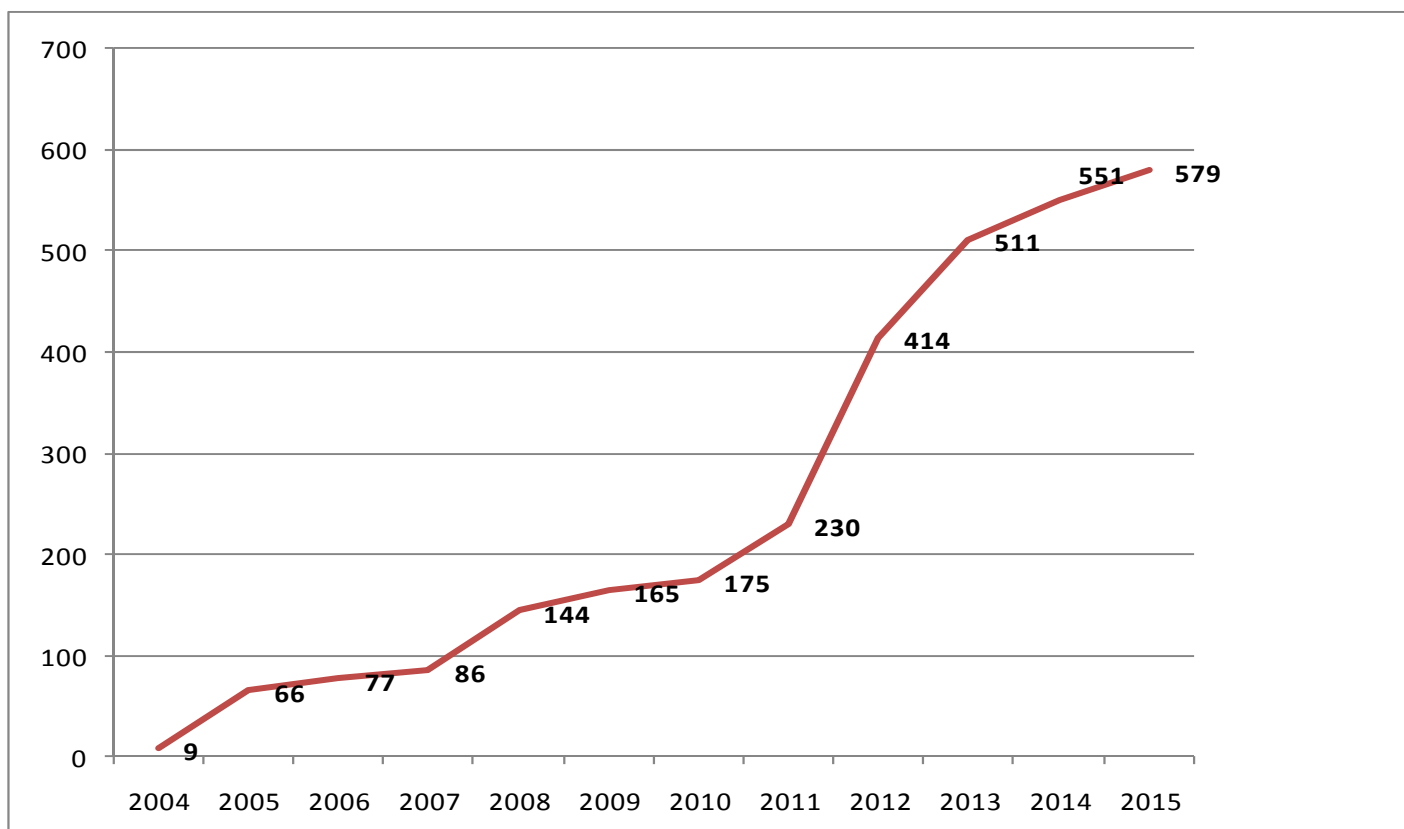

Guidance for authors

The corresponding author should use this form to declare all funding sources and competing interests for the presentation being submitted. ALL authors are requested to disclose to the corresponding author any actual or potential conflict of interest including any financial, personal or other relationships with other people or organizations within three years of beginning the work submitted that could inappropriately influence, or be perceived to influence, their work. Authors should use the following questions to declare funding sources and to decide whether they have any competing interests:

1. Funding sources

1.1. Funding sources for this work

List all funding sources for the work. If the present work was supported directly or indirectly by the alcohol industry, or by third-party organizations funded by the alcohol industry, please give both the name of the organization (e.g., the International Center for Alcohol Policies) and describe its connection with the industry if that connection would not be apparent to the conference participants. If none declare "None", if yes, please describe organization and type of financial award. 2. Competing interests: Financial support of other work & employment

INEBRIA Co-Ordinating Committee Conflict of Interest Policy & Declarations

Members of the Co-Ordinating Committee (CC) of INEBRIA will strive to avoid any conflict of interest between the interests of the Organisation on the one hand, and personal, professional, and business interests on the other. This includes actual conflicts of interest as well as perceived or potential conflicts of interest.

The purposes of this policy are to protect the integrity of the Organisation's decision-making processes, to enable stakeholders to have confidence in the organisation's integrity, and to protect the integrity and reputation of INEBRIA members.

As outlined in the INEBRIA position statement on the alcohol industry, members of the Coordinating Committee may not have worked with or received funding from the alcohol industry directly or indirectly, in the 5 years prior to their election date, or during their term of office.

Upon appointment each CC member will make a full, written disclosure of funding, interests, such as relationships, and posts held, that could potentially result in or be perceived as a conflict of interest. This written disclosure will be kept on file and will be updated annually?.

In the course of meetings and activities, CC members will disclose any interests in a transaction or decision where there may be a conflict between the organisation's best interests and the member's best interests or a conflict between the best interests of two organisations that the CC member is involved with. If in doubt the potential conflict must be declared anyway and clarification sought from the rest of the CC.

In the case of a conflict of interests arising for a CC member, the following procedures apply:

1. The CC member who has declared the conflict of interest withdraws from the part of the meeting at which there is discussion of any arrangement or transaction to which the conflict of interest is relevant;
2. The CC member who has the conflict of interest does not vote on any such matter and is not to be counted when considering whether a quorum of CC members is present at the meeting;
3. Any such disclosure and the subsequent actions taken will be noted in the minutes.
4. The President will discuss the conflict of interest and its implications with the CC member concerned and recommend to the CC whether any additional actions are required.

This policy is meant to supplement good judgment, and CC members should respect its spirit as well as its wording.
